Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Ugly Jr/Sr High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact the Ugly Jr./Sr, High School office for assistance.

The AER is available for you to review electronically by visiting the following web site, www.ublyschools.org or you may review a copy in the main office at your child's school.

For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

When looking at the MI School Data site's "Combined Report," the most relevant take away from the data is the small gap that exists around socio-economic status and its relationship to proficiency on the state assessments. Across all subject areas, students who were categorized as "economically disadvantaged" scored lower on the assessments than those who were not at a disadvantage. Ugly Jr/Sr High does have programs in place to aid these students including our "Mentor Program," which offers students 1-on-1 peer help. Students with transportation issues can get help from the Thumb Area Transit bus for little or no cost. We also have increased the communication from teachers to parents, so they are more up to date on current grades and assignments.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Ugly Jr/Sr High School has an open enrollment and is the only Jr/Sr High School in the Ugly School District.
2. Ugly Jr/Sr High School updates the School Improvement Plan yearly. The School Improvement Plan includes goals to boost achievement in Math, Reading, Writing, and School Culture and includes strategies and activities such as the use of evidence-based literacy instruction, differentiated instruction, Project Based Learning, and Restorative Practices to accomplish those goals.

3. Ubly Jr/Sr High School students are eligible to attend three specialized schools that are operated by the Huron Intermediate School District as well as several CTE programs. Descriptions can be found at: <http://www.hisd.k12.mi.us/>

5. Percent of students that met or exceeded benchmark:

6. 50 students were represented at Parent-Teacher Conferences on October 12, 2023. This represents 29% of our total student body.
7. 112 students were represented at Parent-Teacher Conferences on October 13, 2022. This represents 35.2% of the total student body.
8. 87 students were represented at Parent-Teacher Conferences on October 14, 2021. This represents 28.4% of the total student body.
9. Other Data:
 1. In 2022-2023 – a total of 15 out of 177 possible students were enrolled in post-secondary classes, about 8% of the eligible student body.
 - a. In 2021-2022- a total of 10 out of 180 possible students were enrolled in post-secondary classes, about 6% of the eligible student body.
 - b. In 2020-21 – a total of 16 out of 172 possible students were enrolled in post-secondary classes, about 9% of the eligible student body.
 - c. In 2019-20, 15 out of a possible 177 students were enrolled in post-secondary courses which is about 8% of the eligible student body.
 2. From 2018 to 2023, we offered AP Eng, AP Computer Science Principles and Calculus. There were also AP course offerings through Michigan Virtual High School.
 - a. In 2022-2023, In Person AP class were offered. 5 students took AP Calculus.
 - b. In 2021-22, In person AP classes not offered. AP classes were offered through MIVHS. No students took AP classes during 21-22 School year.

- c. In 2020-2021: 1 student in the AP English Language course took the AP exam (7%) and 1 passed and earned college credit (100%). 0 students in the AP Calculus course took the AP exam. 3 students in the AP Computer Science course took the AP exam (20%) and 2 passed and earned college credit (66%).
- d. In 2019-20, there were 11 students enrolled out of a possible 50 in the AP English Language course which was 24% of the eligible students, 18 of a possible 128 enrolled in AP Computers which was about 14% of eligible students, and 9 students of a possible 50 were enrolled in AP Calculus which is about 18%.
- e. In 2020-21: 1 student in the AP English Language course took the AP exam (7%) and 1 passed and earned college credit (100%). 0 students in the AP Calculus course took the AP exam. 3 students in the AP Computer Science course took the AP exam (20%) and 2 passed and earned college credit (66%).
- f. In 2019-20: 4 students in the AP English Language course took the AP exam (36%) and 3 passed and earned college credit (75%). 0 students in the AP Calculus course took the AP exam. 3 students in the AP Computer Science course took the AP exam (17%) and 0 passed and earned college credit (0%).
